



## ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



Camerata California Artistic Director, Pete Nowlen, has been a dynamic part of the northern California musical scene for nearly 30 years. Dedicated to renewing and sustaining classical music's relevance in our society, Pete's career has led him to surprisingly diverse opportunities.

Currently, he holds artistic and musical director positions with

seven organizations ranging from Music in the Mountains in Nevada County to the San Francisco Lesbian/Gay Freedom Band and including the Rancho Cordova Civic Light Orchestra, the CalCap Chamber Music Workshop and Sacramento's VITA Academy. A long-time faculty member at both UC Davis, where he is director of Concert Bands, and Sacramento State, Pete has mentored a generation of musicians and music educators for our region and beyond.

As a guest conductor, Pete has led performances of the Sacramento Symphony and Philharmonic and the, Auburn, Camellia, Veridian, UCD and CSUS Symphonies as well as numerous honor bands and orchestras. He has served as musical director for more than a dozen theatrical productions ranging from La Bohéme, Magic Flute and Hansel und Gretel to Rocky Horror Show and Little Shop of Horrors.

A prize-winning French hornist, Pete came to Sacramento in 1987 to join the horn section of the Sacramento Symphony. He joined the Music in the Mountains Orchestra in 1989 and has performed frequently with the San Francisco Symphony, Opera and Ballet Orchestras and all of the prominent orchestras of the Bay Area and Northern California. For several years he served as principal hor- nist of the International Orchestra of Italy, performing and recording in Italy's most prestigious festivals and venues.

## A brief note about tonight's program —

MASS IN C MAJOR, K. 317 "Coronation"

The Mass in C Major is generally regarded as Mozart's greatest complete Mass setting, one of fifteen he wrote in Salzburg. Those which he started in Vienna after leaving the employ of Archbishop Colloredo remained incomplete. Although his C-minor Mass (1782) and Requiem (1791) are indisputably his finest achievements in sacred music, both were left unfinished—the former for unknown reasons, and the latter, interrupted at first by the commission of the opera La clemenza di Tito for the coronation of Emperor Leopold II in Prague, and thereafter by his untimely death in 1791. It is likely that it was this coronation, whose festivities included a performance of the C Major Mass conducted by Salieri, that attached "Coronation" to its name.

## Laudate Dominum

The Vesperae Solennes de Confessore was the last work Mozart wrote for his taskmaster employer, Archbishop Colloredo. For this movement, he creates one of the most lyrical and beautiful soprano solos in all of his compositions. It is a gentle hymn of praise, with soaring, expressive melody for the soloist, accompanied by liquid, flowing instrumental lines. The chorus enters quietly at the Gloria patri, expressing the emotion of the section both softly and with fervor.

## Regina Coeli

Composed in Salzburg in the late I 770's, Mozart's Regina coeli in C Major, K. 276, is a work of great exuberance which explodes with energy and joy from the very first note. The Regina coeli is particularly notable for Mozart's sensitive treatment of the text.





# Burr C. Phillips — Baritone

Burr Phillips joined the faculty of University of the Pacific in the fall of 2007. Previously, he was a faculty member at the University of Texas (Arlington), Southern Methodist University, and Northern Arizona University. He holds the MM in Vocal Pedagogy and Performance from Texas Christian University and the BM in Vocal Performance from the University of North Texas.

Mr. Phillips has performed with the Dallas Symphony, Royal Philharmonic (London), Fort Worth Symphony, Honolulu

Symphony, and San Antonio Symphony. He has also appeared with Sacramento Opera, the Santa Fe Opera, Dallas Opera, Fort Worth Opera, Houston Grand Opera, Chautauqua Opera, and Carmel Bach Festival. He has taught at the Big Bear Lake Festival of Song (Big Bear Lake, CA) as well as the Taos Opera Institute (Taos, NM) since the summer of 2010. Sought after as an adjudicator for various national competitions in singing, Mr. Phillips has served on juries for the National Association of Teachers of Singing Artist Award (NATSAA) on regional levels in San Jose, CA and Las Vegas, NV. In the Fall of 2012, he served as a jury member to adjudicate the preliminary rounds for the Texoma Singer of the Year competition at the University of North Texas (Denton, TX). This event drew singers from Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Arkansas and Louisiana. At the Conservatory, Mr. Phillips teaches private voice, vocal coaching, lyric diction and assists in the preparation of opera.



# Robin Fisher — Lyric Coloratura

Ms. Fisher has performed to critical acclaim in such cities as Paris, Vienna, Prague, Hamburg, Chicago and Dallas. Press reviews remark on her "amazingly precise coloratura, melting diminuendi, splendid high notes and delightful musicality" (Opernwelt) and her "mature timbre and total self-assurance.... an extremely exciting singer-actress" (Westdeutsche Zeitung).

On the opera stage, she appeared in 2009 as Susanna in Mozart's Le nozze di Figaro with Sacramento Opera and as

Pamina in The Magic Flute with Townsend Opera Players. In concert, she has been a featured soloist with regional ensembles such as the Capella Antiqua in Messiah, with Camerata Capistrano in the Bravo Bach! Festival, and in Beethoven's Ninth Symphony with the Folsom Symphony. At the Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts (Davis, CA) in Mendelssohn's Lobgesang Symphony with the Sacramento Choral Society & Orchestra, the Sacramento Bee critic found that "Soprano soloist Robin Fisher was thrilling..." Ms. Fisher's many recital appearances in both Europe and the United States attest to her love for the art song. She has recorded chamber works for flute and soprano with Laurel Zucker (The Nightingale Sings), and a compact disc recording of sacred American art songs in collaboration with pianist Dalton Baldwin was issued in 2003 (God be in my Heart). National Public

Radio broadcast an interview and concert excerpts in 2002 from her lecturerecital series "Poetry and Music in the American Art Song." Most recently, Ms. Fisher premiered a cycle of songs composed for her by Jeffrey Hoover at the Festival of New American Music in Sacramento, and she performed a solo recital of American art songs with pianist Hatem Nadim as a guest at the State Music Conservatory of Mannheim, Germany. A new edition of American Art Song & American Poetry, co-authored with scholar Ruth Friedberg, was published in 2012 with a foreword by baritone Thomas Hampson. Together with Friedberg, Ms. Fisher also published The Selected Writings of John Duke in 2007 with a foreword by Ned Rorem. Ms. Fisher won both the prestigious Fulbright-Hayes Scholarship and a Rotary Foundation Award to pursue studies in Europe, and received the coveted Artist's Diploma cum laude from the University of Vienna. She holds a D.M.A. degree from the University of Texas at Austin. A native of California, she began her vocal studies at San José State University. Her students have won vocal competitions and are active performers and teachers throughout the United States. Ms. Fisher is Professor of Voice in the Sacramento State School of Music, where she joined the faculty in 2003.

# Valerie Loera — Mezzo-Soprano

Valerie Elizabeth Loera is currently pursuing a Masters of Music degree in Vocal Performance at Sacramento State under the instruction of Dr. Robin Fisher. Valerie holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Vocal Performance from California State University, Fresno where she studied with Brigid de Jong and Helene Joseph Weil. Other recent solo performances include Vivaldi's Gloria, Handel's Messiah, and Shostakovich's From Jewish Folk Poetry. Valerie is also the female voice for the Kevin A. Memley Studio



Chorale and has also been a member of the Fresno Master Chorale, Fresno State Chamber Choir, Fresno State Concert Choir, and Fresno State Opera Theatre. Valerie has spent the past two summers studying and performing Italian Opera and Art Song as part of the Lingua e Canto Summer Program in Sant'Angelo in Vado, Italy. Past operatic roles include the Blind Woman in The Secret of Luca, Gypsy in Carmen, and Lady Billows in Albert Herring.



# Matt Hidalgo — Tenor

Matt Hidalgo is a graduate of California State University, Sacramento; and holds a Bachelor's of Music in Vocal Performance. He has sung and performed regularly throughout the greater Sacramento region and is a familiar face with many local performing groups. Matt performs regularly with St Mark's United Methodist Church, Fifth Church of Christ Scientist, Sacramento Opera, The Sacramento Choral Society, Capella Antiqua, Sacramento's Classical Revolution, the

choirs at UC Davis, the Carson City Chamber Singers in Carson City, NV; and is also a regular performer for the St Mark's annual Bravo Bach! Festival.

Recently, Matt returned to his alma mater to perform the role of Paolino in Dominico Cimarosa's II Matrimonio Segreto with the Sacramento State Opera Theater under the direction of Omari Tau. In Spring 2014, Matt was also asked to return to Sacramento State to perform the role of Pluto in Jacques Offenbach's Orpheus in the Underworld; also under the direction of Tau. In 2013, Matt made his Sacramento Opera solo debut as Eddie Pensier for Sacramento Opera's 2013 opening production of The Bremen Town Musicians at Fairy Tale Town. Matt's operatic career highlights include Don Ottavio in Mozart's Don Giovanni, Tamino in Mozart's Die Zauberflöte, Sir Hugo in Gerald Cockshott's The Faun in the Forest, Don Basilio and Don Curzio in Mozart's Le Nozze di Figaro, Mercury in Offenbach's Orpheus in the Underworld, and Luiz in Gilbert and Sullivan's The Gondoliers.

A distinguished concert performer, Matt Hidalgo has performed the tenor solos in Benjamin Britten's Serenade for Horn and Tenor, Haydn's Missa Celensis, Händel's Messiah, Saint-Saëns' Oratorio de Noël, Bach's Coffee Cantata, Haydn's Paukenmesse, and Pergolesi's Magnificant.

# Ava DeLara — Soprano

Although Ava has performed leading roles with several of California's regional opera companies, including Townsend Opera Players, North Bay Opera and the San Francisco Children's Opera, she has primarily focused on concert and recital work. Her oratorio work includes Rossini's Stabat Mater, Händel's The Messiah and Dixit Dominus, Haydn's Missa in Augustiis and Die Schöpfung, Fauré's Requiem, Mozart's Vesperae Solennes de Dominica, Verdi's Messa da Requiem (a television broadcast) and Te Deum, Saint-Saëns' Oratorio de Noël, Randall



Thompson's The Nativity according to St. Luke, Vaughn Williams' Dona Nobis Pacem, Respighi's Lauda per la Natività del Signore, Vivaldi's Gloria, Pergolesi's Stabat Mater, and J.S. Bach's Magnificat, St. Matthew Passion and B Minor Mass.

As a guest soloist with many Regional California orchestras, Ava has had the great privilege to sing many beautiful and challenging concert works, such as Das himmlische Leben from Mahler's Symphony No. 4, Mendelssohn's Hear My Prayer, Ravel's Kaddisch, and Händel's Gloria in excelsis Deo and Salve Regina. Her membership with Camerata California has given her the rare and exciting opportunity sing the music of some of the world's leading living contemporary composers (Karl Jenkins, John Corgliano, Gabriel Ruiz-Bernal, Matthew Harris, James DeMars). Camerata also gave her the honor of singing Gounod's Gallia for the Centennial of the Panama Pacific Exhibition at the Palace of Fine Arts in San Francisco. She has appeared with the Solano Symphony, Camellia Symphony, Auburn Symphony, Gold Country Chamber Orchestra, Camerata California Chamber Orchestra, the Sacramento Choral Society Festival Symphony, VITA Academy and the Valley Choral Society Orchestra.

Ava has also performed in recitals, music festivals and concerts extensively throughout Northern and Southern California, Europe, Central Mexico, and the Philippines. In addition, she has sung benefit performances for the Sacramento Women's Chorus and a local AIDS care program, a benefit concert for Habitat for Humanity to help rebuild homes in New Orleans after the devastation from hurricane Katrina, and for "at risk" children in Napa, CA.



# Savannah Swan — Mezzo-soprano

Savannah's vibrant personality from a very young age made her drawn to the arts. Growing up, she has been able to travel and sing internationally with Main Street Singers at Los Altos High School and West Valley College's Chamber Singers. In 2016, Savannah was recommended by a professor to joined the Opera San Jose chorus for La Boheme. She was then invited to singchorus for the full 2017-2018 season, including the role of "Lolette" in Puccini's La Rondine. Now under the guidance of Dr. Robin Fisher, Savannah hopes to continue

growing as a young mezzo soprano opera singer in the years to come."

# Roy Domoe — Baritone

Mr. Domoe is a graduate of CSUS's voice program. During his time, he studied under Dr. Robin Fisher and Omari Tau until graduating with his Bachelor of Music in 2018. Roles that Roy has performed include Signor Deluso in Pasatieri's Signor Deluso; Leporello in Don Giovanni and Geronimo in Cimarosa's II Matrimonio Segreto. Scenes include Robert Ward's the Crucible and Handel's Acis and Galatea.

Currently, he teaches choir and private voice in the Sacramento area while performing with Camerata Californa, Light Opera

Theater of Sacramento and Sacramento Opera. He has also been a part of San Francisco area's Pocket Opera for its 2019 season in English adaptations of Donizetti's The Elixir of Love and Smetena's Two Widows in it's upcoming 2020 season with Rossini's La Cenerentola.



# Amanda Britt — Soprano

Born and raised in Redding California, Amanda Britt has been involved in musical and choral productions for the last 15 years.
