Dr. Ryan Enright, Organist

A very warm *Schola* welcome to Ryan Enright who very recently completed his DMA in Organ Performance and Literature at the Eastman School of Music . Ryan was one of sixteen finalists in the Canadian International Organ Competition held in Montréal, Quebec in October 2011.

A native of Montréal, Quebec, Ryan has taken first prizes in the RCCO (Royal Canadian College of Organists) National Organ Playing Competition (2007), the Quebec Organ Competition (2004), and the Canadian Music Competition (1998)

Ryan is a graduate of McGill University in Montréal where his teachers were John Grew and William Porter. His studies have taken him to Holland, France, and Italy. Ryan has also competed in international competitions in Dublin and Kotka, Finland. Ryan is an avid recitalist and is known for his skills as an organ improviser. In the past year Ryan has given two well-received and highly-acclaimed organ recitals in the Sacramento region.

Ryan is the organist at St. John's Lutheran Church in Sacrament and is the accompanist for the Sacramento Choral Society and a member of the Sacramento Choral Society's orchestra. In addition to yoga, Ryan enjoys hiking and discovering the beauty that California has to offer.

Dr. Donald Kendrick, Music Director

Director of Music at Sacred Heart Church and Founder of Schola Cantorum (1992) and Vox Nova Sacred Heart's Men's Chorus (2004), Dr Donald Kendrick is also Director of Choral Activities at Sacramento State University, Sacramento where he heads the Graduate Degree program in choral conducting.

Dr. Kendrick served as Chorus-master for the Sacramento Symphony
Orchestra and was Artistic Director and Co-Founder of the Sacramento
Children's Chorus. In 1996 he established the award-winning Sacramento
Choral Society and Orchestra, a unique arts organization with its own
professional symphony orchestra.

In Canada, Dr. Kendrick served as Organist and Choir Master at St. Paul's Cathedral in Regina, Saskatchewan and at Christ Church Cathedral in Hamilton, Ontario. He has studied at the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago, Boston's New England Conservatory of Music, and Stanford University, and he holds a doctoral degree from the Eastman School of Music.

Dr. Kendrick has taught at Louisiana State University, the University of the Pacific, and at universities in Canada. He made his Carnegie Hall conducting debut in 1995, with a performance of Verdi's Requiem, and returned in 2003 to conduct Orff's *Carmina Burana*.

Dr Kendrick made his conducting debut in Europe in 2004 and in China in 2006. In June 2008, he made his Walt Disney Concert Hall debut in Los Angeles with the Sacramento Choral Society and Orchestra in a performance of the Mozart *Requiem* & Lauridsen's *Lux Aeterna*. In 2011 KVIE chose to showcase Dr. Kendrick and the Sacramento Choral Society & Orchestra in a unique half hour Public Television documentary that is now nationally offered on PBS stations throughout the United States.

Under Dr. Kendrick's leadership, Schola has created 9 compacts discs and has toured nationally and internationally to Spain, Italy, England, Austria and Canada. He and Schola recently accepted an invitation to return to Rome in June 2013 to sing at St. Peter's Basilica to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Papal Choir at the Vatican. During this time Schola will also perform concerts at the Church of St. Cecilia in Rome, at *Orsanmichele* in Florence, as well as in *Santa Maria dei Miracoli* in Venice.

The Cappella Giulia was founded by Pope Julius II in 1513, in the last year of his Pontificate. Great Musicians have guided the Choir, starting by its first Maestro, Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina, Animuccia, Pitone, Scarlatti, Boezi, and many others. We are starting to prepare the Celebrations for the Fifth Century of the "Cappella Giulia" (1513 – 2013). We would like to celebrate this anniversary with other valuable choirs of the world.

The Choir you direct was indicated to me by Mr. Antonio Luongo. He told me that, in the past years, you came in pilgrimage to Rome, and that you had wide appreciation to the celebration and concert you gave in the Holy City. I would like to invite you to participate to one of the Celebrations we will have during this Jubilee Year of the Cappella Giulia, if you happen to do another pilgrimage in Rome during the year 2013.

I assure my prayers for you and your choristers during this Holy Season.
